Hello Members!

Warning! This article contains several four-letter words that may be offensive to bikers!

COLD: The seasons are changing, and cold air is the norm on a daily basis! Alright, maybe this is obvious, but I'm going to say it anyhow, because I think we've all been "too tough" to admit we're cold at one time or other. Layer up! The best protection against the cold is several layers of clothing that trap air for insulation. I know someone out there is saying right now that heated gear beats layering. My own view on that is that the layers don't require an electrical source, and can be adjusted to a minimum if the day warms up. Layers are also less expensive. Just be sure to have space to pack the layers you might remove. Plan for later in the day, too, in case it gets colder as evening arrives.

And, please, please, PLEASE don't ignore the cold. I know I've been riding where I felt cold, but just wanted to continue on, reach a destination, or make a certain number of miles before stopping. Even with adequate layering, or heated gear, parts of your body can easily get frostbite in cold temps with wind-chill. At 40°F and 60 MPH, the old wind chill chart says it's equivalent to 9°F. At 34°F and 60 MPH, it's 0°F. I don't really understand why there's a 'new' wind chill chart, but can we all agree moving down the highway is colder? And, let's not forget about the factor of precipitation!

RAIN: In mid-Summer, a brief rain storm isn't so scary. Good tires, and gentle maneuvering will get us through safely. But in this part of the year, even a little rain can change the dynamics of wind chill and of tire adhesion drastically. I'm not aware of a chart that converts 40°F at 60 MPH wet, but I can tell you from experience that rain is about the worst thing that can happen to us this time of year. My advice is that if there's any chance of precipitation in the forecast, please delay your ride, or take the cage. Staying relatively close to home is a good plan if you feel you gotta ride! I've been there, too.

SNOW: Yes, there's actually snow in our forecast right now! The weathermen this morning were specifying snow showers on Friday, and forecasting the coldest Halloween since 1996. Believe it or not, I'd rather ride in snow than rain. But none of it's any good, and if we can avoid it, we'll all be safer, and enjoy the riding experience more.

RIDE: Surely, there's more riding days left, and I'm not about to put up my bike just yet. If you're like me, and want to have a few more opportunities to ride, then please plan ahead, watch the weather, and be ready to ditch your plans, rather than ending up in the ditch. There's always next season, and we all want to be there.

If you're ready to put it away for the season, my January 2014 article included some pointers on storing your bike for the season. I'm looking forward to next year, and we want to plan some new events. A few new rides made it into the calendar this year, and there were several other brilliant ideas that didn't quite make it, but which I'd like to see us do next year. If you have any ideas for new rides, please bring those to my attention, and let's see what we can do to make them a reality!

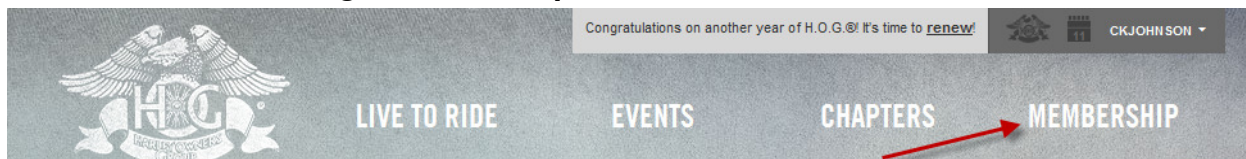
